New Hermitages Opening Scon

t's been a year since the foundations were dug.


The hermitages of St. Juan Diego, St. Josephine
Bakhita, and St. Maximilian Kolbe (pictured at
right and below) are anticipated to be completed in late
October. Labor shortages and supply chain issues
delayed nearly every step of the project. Yet, they will
be finished in God's time; not ours.

Hermitage demand has been strong this fall, and many guests want to experience the new hermitages. While similar in size and structure to the previous hermitages, they include some upgrades to make them more maintenance-free. Due to increased lumber costs,



these hermitages were built using ICF (insulated concrete forms) which provide increased insulating properties, sound prevention, and stability, as well as decreased propane usage. In addition, they feature slightly larger picture and transom windows, steel roofs, a pitched stoop roof, luxury vinyl plank flooring, and LP Smart-siding. Inside, each hermitage has a gliding rocker in the living space and a wooden rocker on the porch, in addition to the usual furnishings.

"We've learned from previous builds how to improve the hermitages, and made choices that should reduce

Preserving Pacem's Environment

Pacem in Terris cares not only for its 240 acres of woodlands, wetlands, and native prairie, but the local environment as well. Here are Pacem's environmental initiatives since its foundation:

- Recycling of plastic, paper, tin, aluminum, cardboard.
- Geo-thermal heating and cooling system for main retreat center, Our Lady of Pacem.
 - Land Stewardship Plans registered with the DNR.
 - Participate in State Ecological Monitoring Network.
- Received One Planet Fund grant from the Franciscan Sisters in Little Falls to convert a portion of lawn grass to native prairie.
- Pacem participates in the State of Minnesota's Adopt-a-Highway program, picking up trash along Highway 47 just north of Pacem's property.
 - LED lighting throughout campus.
 - Solar-powered entrance gate.
 - Regular maintenance, and periodic burning, of Pacem's native prairie landscapes.
 - Regular cutting of oaks affected by oak wilt, and planting of evergreens and other beneficial native tree species.
 - Unpaved roads and parking area to decrease harmful run-off.
 - Lack of power infrastructure in hermitage area to preserve natural setting.
- Maintenance-free siding, steel roofing, and energy-saving insulated foam and concrete construction on new hermitages. Steel roofing is added when replacement roofs are needed.

Furnace Campaign Update - \$40,000 Remains to Be Raised

In July, Massmann Geothermal installed seven new heat pumps in our main building, Our Lady of Pacem, to replace pumps that were 22 years old. The total cost was \$141,000. Thanks to generous donors, \$100,000 towards that total has already been raised. However, Pacem continues to seek benefactors who can offer charitable contributions to cover the remaining \$40,000 for the project. Perhaps you live on a limited income currently, or inflation is making charitable giving difficult for you at present. Have you ever considered including Pacem in Terris as a benefactor in your estate planning or will? Legacy giving is a wonderful way to ensure that Pacem is provided for far into the future through the gifts that God has blessed you with throughout your life.

When a donor decides to leave assets to Pacem in Terris in his or her will, the donor is making a bequest. You can make any of these bequests:

- Unrestricted Bequest—a gift for general purposes to be used at Pacem's discretion.
- General Bequest—a gift of a stated sum or percentage of your estate to Pacem.
- **Residuary Bequest—**a gift to Pacem of the remainder or "residue" of your estate after all other debts, taxes, and other commitments have been paid.
- Restricted Bequest—a gift that allows you to specify how the funds are to be used. If you'd like to make this bequest it's best to consult Pacem in Terris when you create your will to be certain that your intention can be carried out.

Talk to your estate planning professional on how to set up a bequest for Pacem.
