Help Pacem Build 3 New Hermitages

ith great excitement, we announce that Pacem in Terris' Board of Directors is moving forward with building three additional hermitages. This decision was made after much prayer and discernment over how to meet the unprecedented demand that Pacem has experienced in the past eight months.

In January through March, hermit guest numbers broke Pacem's historical records. Each week, we have had to turn away or find later dates to accommodate upwards of 17 guests. Pacem's hermit guests desire to spend time alone with God, the source of peace, especially during these stressful times.

"The pandemic has massively increased the 'noise' in my life – from kids at home to work on screens to the added stress and sleeplessness. I couldn't believe how Pacem reset everything," said guest Katie.

"Pacem is one of the most peaceful places I've ever visited. Perfect in the midst of our world," wrote guest Clayton. "Pacem provides what we need the most in these troubled times, the Peace of Christ that passes understanding," shared guest Mary.

It's been 21 years since the most recent hermitages were constructed. The new hermitages will be situated on vacant

land near St. Francis Hermitage. Construction begins in June. While similar in design, they will utilize maintenance-free materials. Pacem is hopeful that the new hermitages will be ready to use for the busy fall season.

Other Pacem News

• In January and March, approximately 100 oak trees damaged by oak wilt were removed from near St. Paul's hermitage and the parking area.

- For hermit safety, new trails were added. They run parallel with Pacem's roads, giving hermits another way to access their hermitages.
- A motorized gate was added to secure the hermit area.
- Peep-holes were added to each outdoor hermitage entrance door.
- The interior of Our Lady of Pacem main retreat center has been undergoing re-painting.
- Two additional bedrooms in the lower level of St. Joseph House are being readied and have been re-painted. Once completed, St. Joseph House will be able to accommodate a total of five guests. St. Joseph House continues to be used by small groups, clergy, priests, Church staff, and seminarians for retreats.
- Prior to Pope Francis' announcement of the Year of St. Joseph, an icon of St. Joseph was added to Pacem's chapel.
